



## A WORD FROM YOUR SHERIFF

Before heroin was a major issue in the area, families would come into my office and tell me about their child's opioid addiction because they didn't know who or where to turn to. As more overdoses began to occur from heroin and prescription medication and more families came to my office, I started asking when parents first noticed the behavior. I would cringe when they answered, "well, kids are going to be kids. They smoked weed ... they drank."

But what the family didn't notice over time was that 'just' the smoking of weed and 'just' ... alcohol became a greater issue, but they were afraid to talk about the issue and they were afraid to approach it because they didn't know anything about it. They thought their kids would grow out of this. Instead, they grew into that problem.

I've had the richest of families in my office down to the most impoverished – sadly, family members see the addiction but only reach out when it's spiraling out of control. Once someone gets to me, they've almost reached the end of the addiction cycle where death is imminent.

Let's get the community members before the addiction – not when they've spiraled out of control to an arrest from my office or, to their death. We need every business, every community member and every resident in this county to stand up and support QAC Goes Purple. Our strength in this message is unity.

**The Criminal Investigation Unit** (CIU) is responsible for maintaining Sex Offender Compliance which is monitored by A/Cpl. Rickard. Depending on which Tier category they fall into, they are mandated by the State of Maryland to report in person at a minimum of 3 or 6 months to report any updates within their registry requirements. Random checks are also performed to make sure the information they provide is accurate. The CIU team is also responsible for taking over investigations to include but not limited to; all sex crimes, child abuses, robberies, burglaries, thefts over ten thousand dollars, internet crimes, all deaths to include suicides, homicides, and/or any deaths suspicious in nature.

In the month of September 2017, there was a major influx in commercial burglaries in

the Stevensville, Chester, and Grasonville area, mainly targeting small business owners. There were 5 businesses broken into during late night and early morning hours. The CIU team began investigating these burglaries and working with surrounding agencies that had cases that appeared to be the same suspect. In May 2018, the burglaries started occurring again and 8 more small businesses in the same area were broken into. In all, approximately \$1,800.00 in damage had been done and approximately \$1,800.00 in cash had been stolen. Detectives teamed up with Baltimore County Police and a search warrant was drafted by Queen Anne's County detectives and executed on the suspect's

residence in Essex, MD. Numerous pieces of evidence were collected to indicate the suspect in the burglaries. The suspect was charged in June of 2018 for all the burglaries and identified as David Warren Chilcote Sr., a 66yo male from Essex, MD. Chilcote Sr. is currently incarcerated and has several cases pending trial.



Sheriff Gary Hofmann recently accepted the renewal of the Office of the Sheriff accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA®).

The renewal award was accompanied by the Commission's praise for the agency's going "above and beyond" in showing compliance with the relevant standards that represent the "best professional practices" for law enforcement agencies everywhere.

The Sheriff firmly believes that CALEA compliance strengthens the agency's accountability, both within the agency and the community, through a continuum of standards that clearly define authority, performance, and responsibilities.

The Queen Anne's County Office of the Sheriff has developed a comprehensive, well thought out, uniform set of written directives. This is one of the most successful methods for reaching administrative

and operational goals, while also providing direction to personnel.

Sheriff Hofmann has established standards that provide the necessary reports and analyses he needs to make fact-based, informed management decisions.

CALEA accreditation can limit the Office of the Sheriff potential liability and risk exposure because it demonstrates that internationally recognized standards for law enforcement have been met, as verified by a team of independent outside CALEA-trained assessors.

Sheriff Hofmann thanked all employees of the Office of the Sheriff for their roles in proving compliance with the many standards. "It is only with the cooperation and buy-in of every sworn officer and civilian employee that we are able to achieve and maintain this high level professionalism," the Sheriff stated with appreciation.



The Auxiliary Volunteer Deputy Program has been extremely instrumental in the success of the SRU. At this time, the Auxiliary Unit has fourteen active members, who assist with a variety of tasks as directed by SRU Supervisors. The dedicated members of this unit work together with our sworn deputies at the many events around the county. They also take time to patrol the business districts and communities.



## SHERIFFS RESOURCE UNIT

The Sheriff's Resource Unit (SRU) has several different responsibilities. The primary responsibility is to provide security to Queen Anne's County's schools. The SRU work closely with the Board of Education, as well as the private schools in the county. The unit is currently comprised of a Sergeant (Sgt. Jeremy Davidson), Corporal (Cpl. John Brockman), and two other School Resource Officers (SROs) (Dfc. Andrew Neall, & Dfc. Ryan Davidson). During this coming school year they look forward to adding to the staff to adequately patrol the area schools.

In addition to protecting the county's schools, the Resource Unit is also responsible for handling special events throughout the county which majority of these events are handled with the assistance of the Auxiliary Unit as well. The Auxiliary Unit is made up several volunteers that you have probably seen at events this year already. Since the vast majority of the special events in the county are held on the weekends, this can cause the members of the unit to often work long stretches of days to provide coverage at the schools during the week and events on the weekends so we are grateful for the Auxiliary Unit and the volunteer coverage that they provide to the county. During this past summer the Resource Unit has worked 34 special events, 2 of which were Back to School nights at the County Middle and High schools.

Through June 2018, the Resource Unit has worked 42



special events, (8 of which have been school related). Additionally they have also attended over 20 meetings for major upcoming events and various committees and boards that they assist with.

Recently, the Auxiliary Volunteer Deputy Program has really taken off. The restructuring changed the leadership roles among the members and several policies. At this time, the Auxiliary Unit has fourteen active members, who assist with a variety of tasks as directed by SRU Supervisors. The dedicated members of this unit work together with our sworn deputies and are a huge part of the SRU success. A new Auxiliary Deputy Training Program has been implemented and is providing much needed essential training for these volunteers to perform the tasks at hand.

The Event season is in full swing for the Resource Unit. Look for them at many of the Parades, Carnivals, Fairs, and other special events that you attend and of course, please stop by our display tables or just say hi.

One more responsibility maintained by the Resource Unit is the facilitation of Active Assailant Training. With a great deal of assistance from our Chief Management Analyst, Joe Saboury the unit has had many opportunities to present this training to the Board of Education as well as various commercial businesses and banks in our county. We continue to provide this training which focusses on providing trainees with tools needed to survive an active assailant situation in their place of work.

## AVIATION UNIT

In 2017, the Queen Anne's County Office of the Sheriff Aviation Unit was able to fly over 27 flight hours, and 24 flights, in support of Queen Anne Co. Sheriff's and other agencies.

So far in 2018, they have flown several flights for different parts of

the county government. They have also taken aerial photos for the prosecution of suspects charged by the Criminal Investigations Unit. Other flight missions have taken photos used in investigations by the Animal Control Unit.

Earlier this year there was a problem with the aircraft helmets that are used in the Auto Gyro. The helmets are from England, and there was a possibility that the Sheriff's Office would have had to send the helmets to the factory for repair. Fortunately the Sheriff's Office was able to find a factory repair facility in Chesapeake Virginia. We are grateful for this closer factory as the helmets are fixed and like new.

On May 9, Deputy William Schepleng was able to fly to the Summit Airport in Delaware for training. This training was put on by ECHO, East Coast Helicopter Operations. All training from ECHO is always free, and is a great way to advance our program. All parties at the training were glad to see the Auto Gyro, as always, it's a big hit.

This coming year will be as active as others for the Aviation Unit in providing an aerial platform for the Sheriff's Office and other agencies in the county of Queen Anne.

The Queen Anne's County Drug Task Force is a multi-agency task force aimed at combating mid and upper level drug dealers in Queen Anne's County, Maryland. The task force board is comprised of members of the Maryland State Police, Queen Anne's County Sheriff's Office, the Centreville Police Department, the Maryland Department of Natural Resources Police and the Office of the Queen Anne's County State's Attorney.

The Queen Anne's County Drug Task Force reports quarterly to the Task Force Advisory Board. The benefit of the Task Force concept is that it lessens the manpower and budgetary constraints on each participating agency.

The investigative case load carried by the task force grows every year and many of the crimes investigated have roots or ties in other counties and/or states. Investigators at the task force routinely work closely with the FBI, DEA, HSI, the ATF, neighboring drug task forces and state and federal prosecutors to bring these cases to a successful conclusion and to ensure that all persons involved with the drug/criminal networks are brought to justice, no matter where they live.

The Queen Anne's County Drug Task Force is a financially self-sufficient unit, operating off of seized assets at no cost to the taxpayers of Queen Anne's County. Besides using seized, drug related funds to pay for day to day operational expenses, the task force routinely pays for training, equipment and other related costs occurred by member agencies.

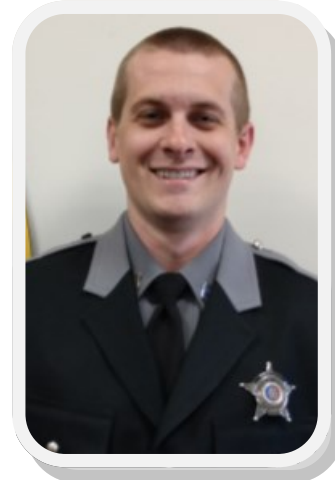
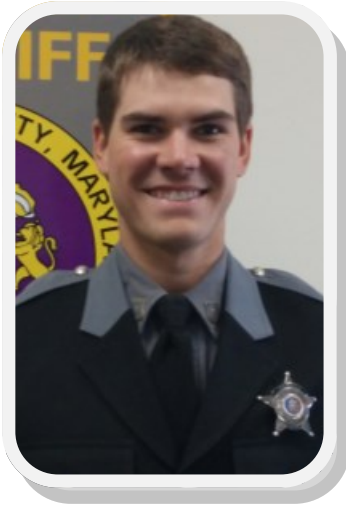
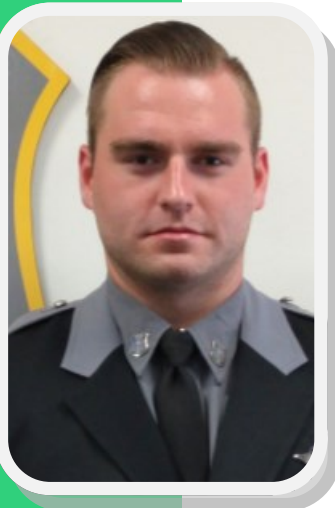

## QACSO PATROL

The Office of the Sheriff for Queen Anne's County provides Prompt, professional, and courteous service to the citizens of the County. The Patrol Unit is the largest Unit within the Agency. The Deputies that are assigned to this unit are scheduled to serve the County twenty-four hours daily and seven days a week. This includes weekends and holidays. This unit is made up of extremely professional police officers that strive to protect your communities day and night. This unit is unique and it is mission oriented. The Unit conducts various different calls of service to include traffic enforcement, drug enforcement, criminal investigations, and much more. The following is a list of activities that the Sheriff's Patrol unit has accomplished since June 1, 2018.

Patrol Deputies completed a total of 6,736 calls for service to include traffic stops. These Deputies completed a total of 458 reports for multiple types of offenses. Sheriff's Patrol Deputies have completed 325 Radar assignments, 124 traffic enforcement, and totaling 2,349 traffic stops. Patrol Deputies have investigated 133 motor vehicle collisions on our County roadways. Out of these collisions, 91 were property damage, 35 were hit and run collisions, 6 were injury, and 1 was a fatal motor vehicle collision. Tragedy can strike at any time, and the Deputies at

the Office of the Sheriff are actively pursuing violators to educate and enforce the State, Federal and Local traffic laws. Speed is perhaps one of the Counties number one complaints and Patrol is active in assisting to resolve these complaints.

Over the past year, drug usage has risen to higher levels to include the use of Heroin combined with Fentanyl. This deadly combination has caused our Patrol Units to respond to numerous overdoses and in some cases, fatalities are the result. The Office of the Sheriff has trained and supplied our Patrol Units with the lifesaving drug called Narcan. This drug is administered through the nasal area and is used to counteract the effects of an overdose. This drug has assisted our deputies with saving lives of people that are struggling with the opioid addiction. Patrol Deputies have investigated 47 cases that resulted in one or more persons being charged with possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance. The Agency K-9 division is actively working on scanning vehicles to assist with the Controlled Dangerous substance trafficking. Our K-9 division has conducted 93 scans for drug detection.

Patrol Deputies have responded to and investigated 71 thefts, 12 Fraud cases, 3 Robberies, and investigated 20 Burglaries. Deputies are equipped with many tools to assist them in processing the crime scene. Deputies have the ability to photograph the

scene, collect fingerprints, and in some cases, collect DNA. Patrol Deputies work in connection with our Criminal Investigations Unit. During the past few months there has been an increase of thefts from Motor Vehicles. Pay attention to where you park and hide important items like purses, cell phones and other valuable items. Please keep loose change and paper currency out of sight.

The Office of The Sheriff for Queen Anne's County has a Constitutional Duty to the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County. Sheriff Deputies to include the Patrol Deputies are assigned the duty of serving the Civil Process Papers of the Courts. During this second quarter, the Patrol Unit has assisted the Sheriff's Courts and Civil Process units by serving 235 court papers and completed 64 attempt of service.

Patrol Deputies are equipped with Body Worn Cameras. These devices are used to gain your trust that our men and women that are behind the badge are adhering to the Agency Policies and Procedures. The body-worn camera also affords our Patrol Deputies the protection from false complaints against them. The Office of the Sheriff for Queen Anne's County has many different units that work a variety of different job functions. All work together to establish the mission of our Agency as a whole. The Office of the Sheriff for Queen Anne's County strives to adhere to the mission of the Agency to be Prompt, Professional, and courteous.

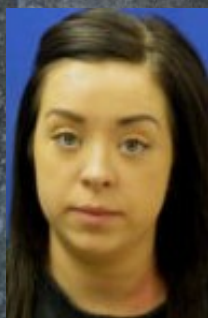
