



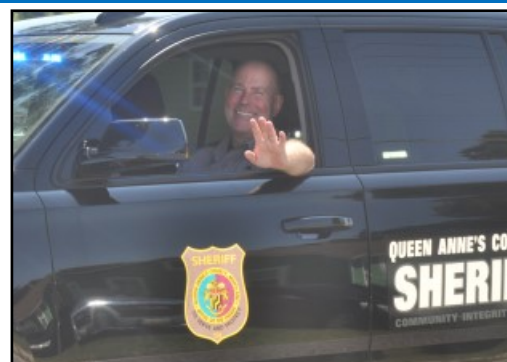
## A WORD FROM YOUR SHERIFF

As your Sheriff I believe that taking a preventative approach to our most common complaint is one of the best ways we can serve the community. Speeding complaints are still our communities' number one concern. We are taking aggressive enforcement in communities, and this means that we are issuing citations. It is something that no one wants to receive, but we have to protect your families and pets. You control the outcome, just slow down; it's not worth the life you will impact!

Speeding complaints in neighborhoods are number one complaint and concern generated from our local community. We all believe that ensuring the safety of our children, our community members and our pets is a very important part of law enforcement and neighborhood partnerships. In many neighborhoods most neighbors will agree that not everybody exceeds the posted speed limit

however it's important to remind our family household members as well as visitors that it is incumbent upon everybody to make a conscious effort to watch their speed when entering a neighborhood.

Most of the time when our office receives complaints about speeding it's always one or two identifiable vehicles or persons whom are the reason the neighborhood feels there is a speeding concern. We've taken the approach to take anonymous tips about these one or two speeding persons and a deputy will personally visit the household and remind them of the speed limits. It's funny because in most occasions the families are very apologetic and didn't even realize their actions and appreciated us reminding them instead of issuing citations. We are all leading busy lives, kids, appointments and so much more. It's easy to forget!

# Patrol Deputies stay extra busy during the summer months

The Office of the Sheriff for Queen Anne's County provides prompt, professional, and courteous service to the citizens of the County. The Patrol Unit is the largest Unit within the Agency. The Deputies that are assigned to this unit are scheduled to serve the County twenty-four hours daily and seven days a week. This includes weekends and holidays.

This unit is made up of extremely professional police officers that strive to protect your communities day and night. This unit is unique and it is mission-oriented. The Unit conducts various calls of service to include traffic enforcement, drug enforcement, criminal investigations, and much more.

The following is a list of activities that the Sheriff's Patrol unit has accomplished since June 1, 2019. Patrol Deputies completed a total of 7,242 calls for service to include traffic stops. These Deputies completed a total of 377 reports for multiple types of offenses. Sheriff's Patrol Deputies have completed 420 Radar assignments, 142 traffic enforcement, and totaling 7,242 traffic stops. Patrol Deputies have investigated 121 motor vehicle collisions on our County roadways. Speed is one of the County's number one complaints and Patrol is active with assisting to resolve these complaints. Deputies have investigated 18 Driving Under the Influence of alcohol and or drugs.

The Patrol Unit currently has two K-9 drug detection dogs, K-9 Konar, and K-9 Drake. Currently, The Office of the Sheriff received funding to purchase a new K-9 drug detection dog. Our newest addition to the K-9 team is a black lab named K-9 Boss and he is currently in training.

Over the past year, drug usage has increased to higher levels to include the use of Heroin combined with Fentanyl. This deadly combination has caused our Patrol Units to respond to numerous overdoses and in some cases, fatalities. The Office of the Sheriff has trained and supplied our Patrol Units with the lifesaving drug called Narcan. This drug is administered through the nasal area and is used to

counteract the effects of an overdose. This drug has assisted our deputies with saving the lives of people that are struggling with the opioid addiction.

Patrol Deputies have investigated 38 cases that resulted with one or more persons being charged with possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance. Patrol Deputies have responded to and investigated 91 thefts, 7 Burglaries, and 2 Robbery cases. Deputies are equipped with many tools to assist them with processing the crime scene. Deputies can photograph the scene, collect fingerprints, and in some cases, collect DNA. Patrol Deputies work in connection with our Criminal Investigations Unit.

Patrol Deputies investigated 57 cases that include Domestic Assault, 2nd-degree assault and sexual assault. The Office of The Sheriff for Queen Anne's County has a Constitutional Duty to the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County. Sheriff Deputies to include the Patrol Deputies are assigned the duty of serving the Civil Process Papers of the Courts. During this first quarter, the Patrol Unit has assisted the Sheriff's Courts and Civil Process units by servicing 302 documents and completed 81 attempted services.

Patrol Deputies are equipped with Body Worn Cameras. These devices are used to gain your trust that our men and women that are behind the badge are adhering to the Agency Policies and Procedures. The body-worn camera also affords our Patrol Deputies the protection from false complaints against them. The Office of the Sheriff for Queen Anne's County has many different units that work a variety of different job functions, and all work together to establish the mission of our Agency as a whole.

## CALEA: THE GOLD STANDARD IN PUBLIC SAFETY

The Office of the Sheriff is complying with its annual audit by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA®).

The assessors review incidents to ensure that field practices are in compliance with the relevant standards representing the "best professional practices" for law enforcement agencies everywhere.

The Sheriff firmly believes that CALEA compliance strengthens the agency's accountability, both within the agency and the community, through a continuum of standards that clearly define authority, performance, and responsibilities.

The Queen Anne's County Office of the Sheriff has developed a comprehensive, well thought out, uniform set of written directives. This is one of the most successful methods for reaching administrative and operational goals, while also providing direction to personnel.

Sheriff Hofmann has established standards that provide the necessary reports and analyses he needs to make fact-based, informed management decisions.

CALEA accreditation can limit the Office of the Sheriff potential liability and risk exposure because it demonstrates that internationally recognized standards for law enforcement have been met, as verified by a team of independent outside CALEA-trained assessors.

Sheriff Hofmann thanked all employees of the Office of the Sheriff for their roles in proving compliance with the many standards. "It is only with the cooperation and buy-in of every sworn officer and civilian employee that we are able to achieve and maintain this high level professionalism," the Sheriff stated with appreciation.



**The Auxiliary Volunteer Deputy Program** has been extremely instrumental in the success of the SRU. At this time, the Auxiliary Unit has fourteen active members, who assist with a variety of tasks as directed by SRU Supervisors. The dedicated members of this unit work together with our sworn deputies at many events around the county. They also take time to patrol the business districts and communities.

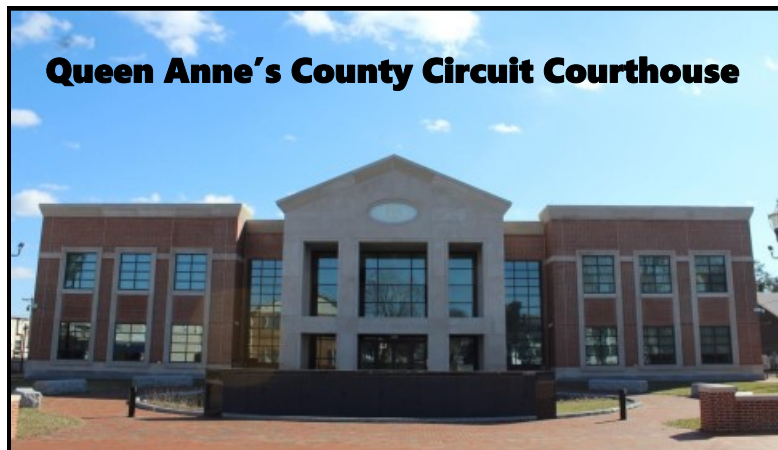

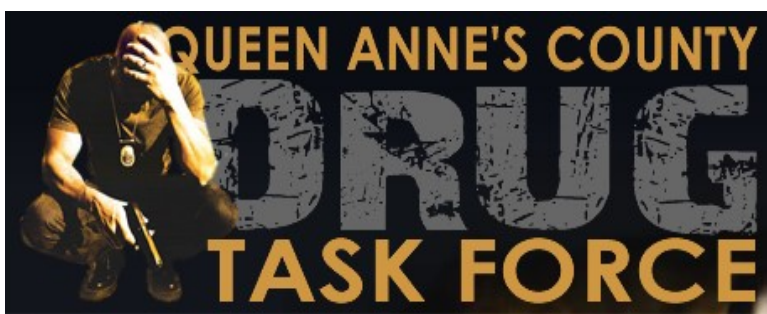

# 14,642 people walk thru Queen Anne's County Circuit Court House



June 17, 2019 was the official opening day of the Queen Anne's County Circuit Court House, and Since opening, 14,642 people have walked through the door. There have been boasts from numerous citizens as to how beautiful the structure is and a huge upgrade from the historic Circuit Court House building, once known as the oldest functioning Circuit Court House in the nation. The Security staff, employed by the Queen Anne's County Office of the Sheriff, was tasked with learning the most up to date electronic equipment, such as the surveillance camera system. The Circuit Court House is equipped with over 100 surveillance cameras, to ensure the safety of not only the Courthouse staff, but the community as a whole.

The Queen Anne's County Drug Task Force is a multi-agency task force aimed at combating mid and upper level drug dealers in Queen Anne's County, Maryland. The task force board is comprised of members of the Maryland State Police, Queen Anne's County Sheriff's Office, the Centreville Police Department, the Maryland Department of Natural Resources Police and the Office of the Queen Anne's County State's Attorney.

The Queen Anne's County Drug Task Force reports quarterly to the Task Force Advisory Board. The benefit of the Task Force concept is that it lessens the manpower and budgetary constraints on each participating agency.

The investigative case load carried by the task force grows every year and many of the crimes investigated have roots or ties in other counties and/or states. Investigators at the task force routinely work closely with the FBI, DEA, HSI, the ATF, neighboring drug task forces and state and federal prosecutors to bring these cases to a successful conclusion and to ensure that all persons involved with the drug/criminal networks are brought to justice, no matter where they live.

The task force has investigated or assisted with the investigations into over two hundred opioid related overdoses that have occurred in Queen Anne's County over the previous two years. The task force, working closely with the Queen Anne's County State's Attorney's Office, the CID unit at the Queen Anne's

County Sheriff's Office and the Maryland State Police have been very successful in charging those responsible for delivering opioids to multiple fatal and non-fatal overdoses. Queen Anne's County now has one of the highest success rates for achieving convictions in these cases.

Investigators with the task force also routinely work hand in hand with the CID units at the Queen Anne's County Sheriff's Office and the Maryland State Police to investigate thefts, robberies and crimes of violence that often have their roots in the use and sales of narcotics.

The Queen Anne's County Drug Task Force is a financially self-sufficient unit, operating off of seized assets at no cost to the taxpayers of Queen Anne's County. Besides using seized, drug related funds to pay for day to day operational expenses, these seized funds are used to pay for training, equipment and other related costs occurred by member agencies.

Our unit also participated in the National Night Out celebrations throughout the county. So far in the year 2019 Resource Unit has covered well over 50 special events, with several more to come this calendar year. Additionally, we have attended several meetings for major upcoming events and various committees and boards in which we will assist.

# Criminal Investigations Unit

On August 24th, deputies responded to the Xtra Mart in reference to an armed robbery. The employee of the store stated that a black male entered the store, demanded money, and threatened to kill the employee. Once the suspect received an undisclosed amount of money, the suspect exited the store. The suspect was described wearing black clothing, a mask, gloves, and displayed a large knife. A search of the area yielded negative results.

The Queen Anne's County Office of the Sheriff criminal investigation's unit began to investigate the robbery. During their investigation, detectives met with officers from Easton Police, Talbot County Sheriff's Office, and Maryland State Police to compare other robberies that had occurred in Talbot County, MD. Detectives canvassed the area of the robbery and were able to locate a nearby business that had video surveillance that captured the suspect and the suspect's vehicle at the time of the robbery. A tag number was able to be read from the surveillance which came back to Montashia Roberts in Easton, MD.

Based on this information along with additional information from the surrounding agencies, a search warrant was drafted by Queen Anne's County detectives and executed with the assistance of Easton Police, Talbot County Sheriff's Office, and

Maryland State Police on August 27th. As a result of the search warrant, Jaron Meekins Jr. was arrested and charged with the robbery that occurred at the Xtra Mart. Several pieces of evidence related to the robberies were recovered. On August 28th Detectives of the Queen Anne's County Office of the Sheriff drafted charges for Montashia Roberts for her involvement in the robbery and the warrant was served on the same day. Both suspects were held without bail and, in addition to the charges in Queen Anne's County, they have charges pending in other jurisdictions for robbery.

Sheriff Gary Hofmann commented, "This is yet another example of allied agencies working together for the betterment of our community. We will not tolerate criminal activity in our county. If you commit a crime in Queen Anne's County, we will hunt you down."

Keep in mind when you go to convenience stores, to take a look at your surroundings to see who is around you and the vehicles in the area. A simple clue such as a tag number could lead to the apprehension of a criminal. Also, be sure to not get involved in the pursuit or apprehension of the suspect (s) but be a "good witness" for investigators. The smallest clue could be what breaks a case.

## SWAT TEAM TRAINING UPDATE

The Office of the Sheriff Swat Team was originally formed in the 1991 at the Direction of then current Sheriff Charles Crossley. The Swat Team was then shut down temporarily and then restarted in 1998. The Swat Team is currently comprised of volunteer members of the Office of the Sheriff that are put through a selection process which consists of an interview, physical agility test, work history evaluation and firearms training scores. Members of the Swat team must maintain current standards with firearms, work evaluation and physical agility standards.

The Swat team trains regularly each month to include topics of firearms training, active shooter scenarios, hostage rescue, high risk warrant service, barricaded gunman and various other tasks. The Swat team has been a member of the National Tactical Officers Association for



the past 19 years and is an active participant in the Maritime Tactical Operations Group which responds to violent incidents on the waterways of Maryland. Currently the team is comprised of 11 Members of the Office.

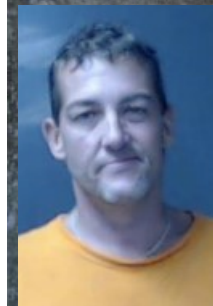

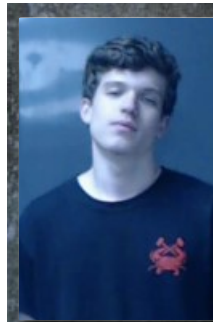
